GUIDELINES & REQUIREMENTS CALL FOR PAPERS SCALLOPS 2025

As part of a series of activities under the Health Insurance Anti-Fraud Forum in collaboration with relevant stakeholders and commercial insurance entities, the Deputy for Legal Affairs, Fraud Prevention and Handling at BPJS Kesehatan is organizing the 2025 Call for Papers.

This initiative aims to enhance contributions from various segments of society by fostering the exchange of knowledge, solutions, and ideas related to the implementation of anti-fraud systems within the National Health Insurance (JKN Program).

PAPER THEME

“Delivering Transparent and Excellent Healthcare (Fraud-Free)”

Within the Scope of:

- Fraud Prevention
- Fraud Detection & Investigation
- Fraud Management

PARTICIPANTS

1. Insurance Companies providing health insurance coverage: general insurance, commercial insurance, social insurance, and/or sharia-based insurance.
2. Students & Academics in the fields of: Law, Medicine, Public Health, Development Economics, and Social & Political Sciences.
3. Anti-Fraud Practitioners: Auditors & Investigators, Law Enforcement Officers, Commercial Insurers, Medical/Paramedical Professionals, Health Facility Management, BPJS Kesehatan employees, Anti-Fraud Information System/IT Developers.
4. Others: General Public/National Health Insurance (JKN) Participants.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

1. Articles must be written in two languages: Indonesian and English, in the form of a descriptive paper based on a literature review, empirical study, or scientific research, and will be selected through a blind review process by the Editorial Review Team.
2. Participants may submit papers on topics related to health, law, information technology, health economics, or general themes, as long as they are aligned with the main article theme.
3. Manuscripts should be prepared using Microsoft Word, in Times New Roman, 11pt font, 1.5 line spacing, single column format, justified alignment, on A4-sized paper, and should be between 4,000–6,000 words in length.
4. The structure of the article should include:
 - a. Article title (10–15 words). Capitalize Each Word. Font size 16pt, centered.
 - b. Author name: without academic titles, and include the author's institutional affiliation. Font 11pt, centered. If there is more than one author, only the corresponding author should include the correspondence address. The correspondence address must include email, full name, and institutional affiliation, written in font size 10pt, centered.
 - c. Abstract: consists of one paragraph written in English. No more than 250 words. It should clearly state the purpose, methods, and results of the research or study. No citations are allowed.
 - d. Keywords include up to 5 relevant elements related to the article. Separate each element with a semicolon (;).
 - e. Article structure:
 - Introduction
 - Methode
 - Results
 - Discussion
 - Conclusion
 - Acknowledgment – Optional
 - References
 - f. Each section and subsection title should be written in bold or bold-italic.
 - HEADING 1 (all caps, bold, left-aligned, 11 pts)
 - Heading 2 (capitalize the first letter of each word, bold, left-aligned, 11 pts)
 - Heading 3 (capitalize the first letter of each word, italic-bold, left-aligned, 11 pts)

- g. Table Format: Tables should be numbered and accompanied by a title placed above the table. The title must be in bold, 10pt font size, and centered. Table content should be in 10pt font, single-spaced. Each table must be explained in the text.
 - h. Figure Format: Figures should have high resolution, with a number and caption placed below the figure, in bold, 10pt font size, and centered. Each figure must be referenced in the text.
 - i. Citation and References: Follow APA 7th edition style, listed in alphabetical order. References must include a minimum of 15 sources published within the last 10 years (exceptions apply to currently valid laws and regulations).
5. Any additional writing guidelines will be communicated to the authors during the initial stage of the paper review process.

WRITING REQUIREMENTS

1. The article must not have been previously published or currently under consideration for publication in another journal.
2. Plagiarism check result must be less than 15%.
3. The participant guarantees that the submitted article:
 - a. Does not violate any applicable laws or regulations
 - b. Does not infringe upon the intellectual property rights of any party
 - c. Does not disclose any confidential information of any party
 - d. Has not been previously submitted to similar competitions or published in any journal (national or international)

Article Title (Capitalize Each Word – Centered - Times New Roman 16 pts)

Abstract: Please write the abstract in English, with a maximum of 250 words. The abstract contains the purpose and scope of the study, the method used, a summary of results, and a conclusion. (Times New Roman 1.15 space - 11 pts).

Keywords: Put 3—5 of your keywords here; keywords separated by a semicolon (;)

INTRODUCTION (HEADING 1 – ALL CAPS - TIMES NEW ROMAN 11 PTS)

The introduction should contain (in sequence) a general background, a study of the state of the art as the basis for a scientific statement of novelty of the article, a statement of scientific innovation, and a research problem or hypothesis. The purpose of the article's study should be written at the end of the preliminary section. In the format of a scientific article, there is no permission for a library review as in the research report. Still, it is realized in the form of a state-of-the-art study to demonstrate the scientific relevance of the article. (Times New Roman 11pt)

METHOD (HEADING 1 – ALL CAPS - TIMES NEW ROMAN 11 PTS)

The methodology section contains the research plan, research subject, instruments, data collection procedures, and data analysis presented in the form of paragraphs.

Paragraphs must be in order. All paragraphs must be written using justified alignments, i.e., equally left and right.

Figure 2. shows an example of an image with a low resolution that is less appropriate, while Figure 3. shows an example of a picture with an adequate resolution. Check that the image resolution is sufficient to reveal essential details on the image. (Times New Roman 11 pt)

RESULTS (HEADING 1 – ALL CAPS - TIMES NEW ROMAN 11 PTS)

The result section contains research findings derived from research data and related to the hypothesis.

Please check all images in your journal, both on screen and in print. When checking the printed version of the image, make sure that (1) the color has sufficient contrast, (2) the image is sufficiently clear, and (3) all labels on the image are readable. (Times New Roman 11pt)

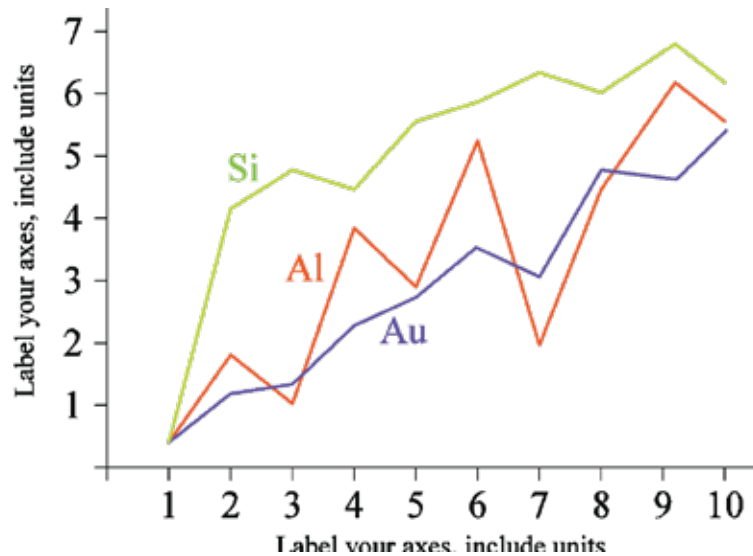


Figure 1. Example Line Graphics Using Contrasting Colors

DISCUSSION (HEADING 1 – ALL CAPS - TIMES NEW ROMAN 11 PTS)

The research discussion section contains discussions of research results and comparisons with theory and/or similar research. This section interprets the research findings, compares them with existing literature, and discusses their relevance to the research question. Avoid repeating the results. The discussion should address:

- How do the results relate to the original research question or objective?
- Do the results provide scientific interpretations for each finding?
- Are the results consistent with those reported by other researchers, or are there differences?

CONCLUSION (HEADING 1 – ALL CAPS - TIMES NEW ROMAN 11 PTS)

This section summarizes the answers to the hypotheses, purposes, and findings of the research and suggestions related to further research ideas. Conclusions are presented in paragraph form.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT (OPTIONAL) (HEADING 1 – ALL CAPS - TIMES NEW ROMAN 11 PTS)

The title for the thank-you speech and the reference are not numbered. Acknowledge those who contributed to the research, especially financial supporters, advisors, and other contributors (e.g., proofreaders, typists, or suppliers). Do not acknowledge any of the authors' names.

REFERENCES (HEADING 1 – ALL CAPS - TIMES NEW ROMAN 11 PTS)

All references in the article text must be listed in the Library List section. Writing a bibliography and quotations in the APA 7th edition style is recommended using management software such the Mendeley application. Each article must have at least 15 reference lists (Times New Roman 11 pts). References must be from last 10 years (except for laws still in effect)
